Purdue University is currently in the fourth year of a tuition freeze about which President Mitch Daniels has boasted widely. During the time that the freeze has been in place, the number of in-state undergraduates has dropped by 1,228 and the number of out-of-state students has

gone up by 336, <u>The Indianapolis Star</u> reported. With those changes, a majority of Purdue students are now from outside the state. Out-of-state students pay much more in tuition, and those funds have become much needed during the tuition freeze. Tuition for a year at Purdue is 10,002 for Indiana residents, \$29,000 for out-of-stater from the rest of the United States, and \$31,000 for international students.
